Then he takes refuge to his friend's place in Ardebil. Plain Clothes men are chasing the defeated and there is chaos everywhere. Some people are being cruelly executed in military barracks. The organizer of the cult is cut in half in Sarab and each half is hanging from a gate. Ballash reaches the outskirts of the destination city with difficulty. He gets killed there while a -2years-old child accompanies him. The beasts tear up his carcass. During all the coming years, Bolot - the child that Ballash has left behind- hears a voice that repeats: " I'm burnt, God, I'm burnt" and gradually without chronological order, the destiny of 3 generations takes shape in political upheavals andthe way they become victimized.

This novel is the story of a man killed and dismembered in civil war whose ghost meets his son 15 years after the incident. The story takes shape through this confrontation. The father - Ballash- was an ordinary street vendor with poetic skills. When he takes his poems to Dozgon, the editor of Azerbaijan Newspaper, Dozgon gets impressed by Ballash's voice and invites him to the newspaper and radio and thus, Ballash becomes a journalist. He witnesses defeat of democrat forces by government and chasing and slaughtering of the cult members afterwards. The dependent chiefs pass the Jolfa Bridge and run away into the USSR. Ballash reaches the border with difficulty but then he realizes the treachery of chiefs, so prefers death to leaving the country, especially since he witnessed the innocence of a person.

This book is the story of a young boy named "Jalal". In winter and in the mountainous and snow-covered village of Sabalan heights, Jalal's father dies following a hard illness.


Since his family is in poor financial conditions, he takes the responsibility of them. He had to grown-up before his time and helps his family. But he knows that all his efforts are no use.







He arrives to find the bridge has been destroyed by bombings and a temporary bridge connects two sides of the river. Private Sodeyf's family were killed in Tehran bombings when he was defending the city and this made him wander in a twilight zone between life and death by suicide since he felt guilty about it. Black rain pours down over the town and smears everything. Sodeyf is really isolated and his folks think Base2- has sent him for spying. Commander and a brigadier harass him.

Mehran- his sister's fiancé - comes from the front by train and Sodeyf- who has always shied away from meeting him- goes to meet him but does not mention the incident. He stands on the makeshift bridge in an attempt to jump into river and commit suicide but lacks the nerve to do it. Extreme depression paralyzes Sodeyf but finally while misunderstandings existing between him and others soar, he acquires a stormy attitude but then he calms down until he meets a girl to behold his sister in her eyes. On the other hand, a Sahand rocket battery is planted in the region to defend the bridge. Restoration of the bridge - parallel to Sodeyf's psyche - starts out. But the aircrafts come back and Sodeyf is the one who must launch the rocket. Sodeyf hits the planes and then, for the first time after the incident, finds the courage to start crying bitterly.

This novel written for adults is about the doubts of a soldier whose family has been killed in the war. The soldier is suspended between life and death. Neither he can live nor commit suicide. He was yielded to self-wished banishment. Events happing there appear to return the soldier to life. The style of narration in this story is a bit completed and everything is described in the shadow of ambiguity and hesitation.

Three Portrayals of a Man is a novel by the contemporary author, Mohammad Reza Bayrami, written in three parts according to the biography of martyr Hussein Alam al-Hoda, a commander of the Khuzestan Revolutionary Guards Corps. To reflect the thoughts and the lifestyle of martyr Hussein Alam al-Hoda, the author has tried to use new methods and avoid the stereotypical and cliché methods of writing biographies of prominent historical figures. Bayrami has viewed the life of martyr Hussein Alam al-Hoda from three angles. The first viewpoint is from the perspective of Mabar. A torturer who has often punished Alam al-Hoda under the most severe torture. He talks mostly about Hussein's childhood when Hussein was just an adolescent and always made trouble for the Shah's intelligence apparatus. Mabar personally punished Hussein under the most severe torture. But Hussein still denied him accessing the information. Eventually, after the victory of the Islamic Revolution, Hussein arrests Mabar with the help of the people and the Committee. On his deathbed, Mabar narrates the painful memories of the past years, memories that reveal a part of Hussein Alam al-Hoda's face. Mabar memoirs mostly reflect Hussein's teenage years, a period that ends with the victory of the Islamic Revolution. The author changes his perspective to continue the narrative of the life of martyr Hussein Alam al-Hoda and this time addresses one of Hussein's companions and comrades. A person named Ali, who is a friend of Hussein, and accompanies him from the very first days of the victory of the Islamic Revolution to the moment of Hussein's martyrdom. The third narrative is from the perspective of a character by the name Hassan, the smuggler in the region, who has also been mentioned in the second narrative. Hassan recounts his memories that during the days of the war he was smuggling foodstuffs and so on and with the help of his accomplices, trafficked contraband items across the border and Hassan distributed them in the area of his residence. Thanks to his profession, Hassan is familiar with

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every byway in the area. He also knows the Iraqi forces' locations like the back of his hand.

Hussein Alam Al-Hoda, due to the characteristics of Hassan, goes to meet him at night and asks for help. The same night, as a sign of goodwill, he gives a gun to Hassan so that he would report to the Hoveizeh Revolutionary Guard Corps headquarters the next day. On the same night, Hassan is deprived of his nightly sleep and suffers from internal conflict. He ultimately overcomes his carnal desires and thinks the call for help by Hussein must be a kind of divine test in the aftermath of his crimes.

Saadoun is a young boy from a region near Dujayl, Iraq. While irrigating the palmgrove, he walks a long way along the stream to open the waterway. Finally, he reaches a pond where Ahli and his brothers are swimming. This meeting leads him to fall in love with Ahli. But Saadoun's father is against this marriage because Ahli is a Sunni and Saadoun is a Shia, and this proposal is opposed by both parties. Some rendezvous happens between Ahli and Saadoun. But Saadoun, who is disappointed in marriage, is disillusioned and introduces himself as a soldier. During his military service, he is assigned to the headquarters. With the Dujayl incident and the killing of Shiites, Saadoun is accused of infiltrating the headquarters. He is imprisoned due to this charge. He gets together with Haitham in prison. Haitham, who was in the training course with him (Saadoun), was imprisoned behind the wireless on the charge of spying and talking to an Iranian. The army sends Saadoun along with some people to the Soren region, which is a dangerous place. On the way, the truck carrying them is destroyed and only Saadoun survives. Being wounded, he goes from city to city and writes a letter to Ahli asking her to leave a sign if she is willing to marry him. On the other hand, Khalil is accused of planting summer crops. But Ahli's father - Mohan - becomes his guarantor. The news of Saadoun's death reaches Khalil and they say that his body has not been found. He holds a funeral ceremony and receives a car as a gift from the government. Khalil digs a grave in order to calm the heart of Saadoun's mother and buries Saadoun's belongings in it. Saadoun returns and faces his father. His father considers his escape as a mistake and believes that it endangers his family, but Saadoun is no longer willing to return to the war. The fight ends with the death of Saadoun by his father, and Khalil buries his son in the same grave in amazement and guilt.


Ahli comes to Khalil and says that she has received a letter from Saadoun in which he said that he is injured and will come soon. Khalil does not have an answer to Saadoun's mother's question.

The story of this book takes place in Dujayl village in Iraq. It is the story of a young man who falls in love with a girl, but the custom of the tribe and its formalities do not allow him to have such a relationship. As a response to this deed, the young man commits self-destruction and goes to war. This is the beginning of a strange outcome for him; Contrary to his imagination, the fate does not take place in the front, but in his hometown, from which he had fled.

With a technique, the author has made narratives parallel to the main story line with story flashbacks and by changing the position and space of the narration and the narrator's point of view. In other words, instead of creating a simple dialogue and narration from the protagonist's view, he narrates a marginal story in another space. This simple process is very effective in balancing and floating the story space and moving away from its monotony.

This novel beautifully displays the helplessness of humans against the events of war. He talks about people who, on the one hand, have lost their good human qualities in dealing with the war, and on the other hand, he talks about people who were not allowed to be and live happily by the war, and spent several decades of their lives in failure, death of loved ones, lack of progress and thousands of other limitations.

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

The author has used a simple, fluent and popular tone to write the book. The use of this tone has created intimacy between the author and the reader and conveys


the message to the reader that the characters of the story are only ordinary and earthly people.

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"Morteza" is a seventeen-year-old boy nicknamed "Morteza Gari" who lives in the south of the city in a poor zone with his parents. His parents are indifferent to his education and Morteza is studying in the fourth grade. He spends most of his time with his friends to have fun, football, petty misdeeds, etc. One day, he sees "Fereshteh", a teenage girl in the neighborhood by chance and chases her unintentionally. Fereshteh goes to the market and the cinema. On one occasion, Morteza informs Fereshteh about the presence of a motorcyclist who is chasing her and makes Fereshteh run away. The agents of Shah regime arrest Morteza, without knowing what the issue is? He is interrogated and gradually finds out the important secrets of Fereshteh's political activity. Little by little, he comes to new facts by reviewing his memories and revising the events that he simply ignored.

The story is written from a first-person point of view, and it is actually the confessions of Morteza - the first character - in one of the political prisons. The beginning of the story is also suspenseful and ambiguous.

The story is written in the style of "social realism", and it takes place in the remote and newly built neighborhood called "Ali Abad" in Tehran, whose residents have tasted poverty with all their heart. Morteza and his friend Amir are ice cream sellers, and the author has used this issue as a theme and has used subtle humor to make the novel more attractive.

The atmosphere and pictures of the book are beautiful and are well imprinted in the audience's mind. Descriptions and similes also help symbolically in conveying the message of the story.

Bayrami's narratives in this long story, despite its juvenile structure, are intertwined and at the same time connected. In each layer of his story, by

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introducing the way of life of the boy and his friends, their hobbies, jobs and even the type of their studies, while accurately depicting the social and environmental aspects of a part of Iran's capital in the years before the victory of the revolution, he has succeeded in creating characters that were rarely found in the youth literature of the Islamic Revolution, lovable and unsophisticated characters that can be touched and understood.

It is possible to criticize some chapters of the book The Fifth Chapter: Silence and the way the author deals with linking the topics and content of the story together, but Bayrami's smooth and sweet narrative in this book is so attractive that one can ignore some of the book's narrative flaws. With this reasoning, we can believe that "The Fifth Chapter: Silence" is a new leap from its author to juvenile literature.
